There was no old business


Under new business the Clerk presented the 2026 Budget for approval. The 2026 Budget was approved unanimously after a motion by Paige Phillips and a second by Yvonne Davenport.

The application for a Beer and Wine Permit presented by 10244 Foodmark, LLC d/b/a Chevron was unanimously approved after a motion by Mike McElroy and a second by Steven Hollingsworth.

The Clerk advised that the 2023 Audit will hopefully be completed within the next few weeks; it was decided to take down the Christmas Decorations on January 10th beginning at 10 a.m.; Mayor Barber advised that he had been approached by Charles Dooley on behalf of the Hull Baptist Church to see if the city might have any interest in assisting the church monetarily with placing lights around the track area at the church and purchasing new playground equipment. The area could then be used by church in conjunction with the City. The council expressed interest in learning more about this and Mayor Barber was going to report back to Mr. Dooley and invite him to attend a meeting with more information.
