

MINUTES OF THE CITY OF HULL MAYOR AND COUNCIL

July 23, 2026

The meeting was called to order by Mayor John Barber at 7:00 p.m. at Hull City Hall. Those in attendance in addition to the Mayor were the Clerk, and council members Mike McElroy, Paige Phillips and Steven Hollingsworth. Council member Yvonne Davenport was absent from the minuting. City Attorney Danny Love was also present.

A moment of silent prayer followed the pledge of allegiance.

The minutes of the June meeting were unanimously approved after a motion by Mike McElroy and a second by Paige Phillips. The financial reports were unanimously approved after a motion by Steven Hollingsworth and a second by Mike McElroy.

Under old business, the Zoning and Development Standards Change in Zoning Classification Request Application for ReZoning Review form that was presented by attorney Love was unanimously approved after a motion by Paige Phillips and a second by Mike McElroy.

Under new business the City elected to participate in the Chamber of Commerce's Scarecrows in the City Campaign. This will be discussed further at the August meeting

Attorney, Danny Love, was authorized after a motion by Mike McElroy, a second by Paige Phillips and a unanimous vote, to send a letter to Simone Hall relative to her inquiry about a possible fence encroachment with a neighbor advising her that this would be a matter between her and her neighbor and did not involve the City.

There was some discussion concerning the quality of the lawn maintenance and certain things not being done satisfactorily. Mayor Barber will reach out to Mr. Perdue to give him an opportunity to comply with the contract prior to the city taking any action.

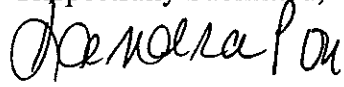
The City discussed an email received concerning the Flock Cameras however no action was taken.

Council member, Paige Phillips, expressed concerns about Building Inspection/Code Enforcement Office, Lynn Shedd, not responding appropriately to a citizen within the City who had some concerns. Mayor Barber will speak with Mr. Shedd about this issue. In addition, Attorney Love and Mayor Barber will reach back out to the County about what would be necessary for the county to take over the code enforcement and building inspection and hopefully have something to share at the August meeting.

At the request of Attorney Love a motion was made by Paige Phillips, seconded and approved that we go into executive session to discuss a litigation matter. Motion was made by Paige Phillips, seconded by Mike McElroy and unanimously approved to come out of executive session.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned after a motion by Mike McElroy and a second by Steven Hollingsworth.
