

Summary of February 26, 2026 Council Meeting

Mayor and Council met for its regular meeting on Thursday, February 26, 2026. The Mayor and all council members were present in addition to the Clerk and City Attorney. Also present was Anna Izquierdo from the Madison County Journal along with members of Hull Baptist Church, Charles Dooley and Don Tyson

Prior to the meeting the Clerk administered the oath to Mayor Pro Tem, Steven Hollingsworth

The minutes and financial reports were approved as presented.

Mr. Dooley along with Mr. Tyson provided more information concerning the placement of outside lights around the track and other areas at the Hull Baptist Church. Council voted to assist the church in paying for the lights at an annual cost to the City of \$1,368.00. Attorney Love will prepare the appropriate resolution.

The Clerk reported that she expected the 2024 audit would be completed and the city would be ready to move forward with the 2025 audit by the March meeting.

Mayor Barber advised that the costs for the new Christmas lights presented at last month's meeting did not include shipping and the council voted to pay the additional charges for the shipping.

Attorney Love presented a draft of a letter to be sent to the county advising them that the City had elected to hire their own building inspection and would not need the county's services. In addition, council was made aware that a license plate reader will be placed on Old Elberton Road near the railroad tracks.

There being nothing further the meeting was adjourned.
