

Summary of March 26, 2026 Council Meeting

Mayor and Council met for its regular meeting on Thursday, March 26, 2026. The Mayor and all council members were present in addition to the Clerk and City Attorney. Also present was Anna Izquierdo from the Madison County Journal.

The City voted to increase the amount paid to Hull Baptist Church for the security lights to cover the actual costs.

The Clerk advised that the 2024 Agreed upon procedures had been completed. It is necessary for the City to Reimburse the SPLOST account for authorized expenditures in the amount of \$6,048.20 however the General Fund can be reimbursed from the SPLOST account for \$9,234.00 for the heating and air system paid from the General Fund.

The City voted to continue with the McLemore Firm to complete the 2025 Agreed Upon Procedures.

Mayor Barber advised that the City was now eligible to receive LMIG and LAR funds for past and current years now that the audits were current.

The Clerk recommended a budget amendment to transfer \$654.00 from the "Other Purchased Services" line item to the "City Insurance" line item to cover the shortage in the actual premium amount from that budgeted.

Mayor Barber is making arrangements to have a dumpster delivered to City Hall for clean-out purposes.

Steven Hollingsworth discussed the requirement that our City web site must be ADA compliant by April 2027.

A request to place a Tiny House on a lot where two mobile homes were previously located is being looked at.

There being nothing further the meeting was adjourned.
